

What is Data Protection?

- Data protection governs how personal data is collected, used, stored, disclosed and destroyed
- OServes to balance rights & expectations of individuals for personal data to be safeguarded against legitimate activities of organisations, including charities



Data Protection reform – why?

- In response to changes in technology & the reach of digital goods & services
- Provides a framework to regulate 'big data' & adapts burden of regulation to match size of organisation & risks associated with the processing
- Provides individuals with more rights & strengthens existing rights





How reform affects charities?

- Charities will need to be accountable for compliance with the new legislation & should be able to demonstrate this
- Charities will need to understand what they do with personal data, why they do it and what safeguards they have in place
- Measures in new legislation build on the existing 8 principles, redefine terms & introduce new provisions

	New Processing	Processing underway
	 New personal data collected on/after 25 May 2018 New purposes for processing commenced after 25 May 2018 	 Personal data collected prior to 25 May 2018 Processed for the same purposes after 25 May 2018
Consent	Consent must meet the new standard	 Existing consent can be used till 25 May 2019 (unless withdrawn) when it must meet new standards
Privacy Notices	 New privacy notices meeting new standard must be provided 	 New privacy notices not needed until 25 May 2019 but if asked for must be provided
Controller – Processor Obligations	Must be addressed	 Existing arrangements are sufficient until 25 May 2019 then need to be addressed
Data Portability	New right comes in on 25 May 2019	New right comes in on 25 May 2019
